

Maryka Biaggio, PhD, is a psychology professor turned novelist with a passion for history and the human spirit. After a successful academic career, she turned to writing historical fiction inspired by real people—figures whose lives illuminate the complexities of their time. Her debut novel, *Parlor Games* (Doubleday, 2013), was praised by New York Times bestselling author Daisy Goodwin as “a wildly entertaining and constantly surprising ride.”

She has since published *Eden Waits*, *The Point of Vanishing*, *The Model Spy*, and *Gun Girl and the Tall Guy*. Her forthcoming novel, *Margery and Me*, will be published by Regal House in April 2026, has been hailed by distinguished author Valerie Martin as “a wry, lively, and wicked-good novel,” and was a Publishers Weekly pick.

Maryka’s fiction has garnered numerous accolades, including a Willamette Writers Award, Oregon Writers Colony Award, Historical Novel Society Review Editors’ Choice, La Belle Lettre Award, a Michigan Upper Peninsula Notable Book Award, and a Regional Arts and Culture Council grant. She served on the Board of the Historical Novel Society North America Conference from 2015 to 2025 and has mentored writers in the Association of Writers and Writing Programs’ Writer-to-Writer Mentorship program since 2020.

An avid opera fan, she also enjoys gardening, art films, and, of course, great fiction. She lives in Portland, Oregon.
